### County teachers' salaries not lowest, not highest

Starting salaries for Nicholas county teachers this fall with bachelor's degrees 305 no experience will be \$9,960.  
The range for the county's 47 Rank III teachers is \$6,000 to \$7,810. Rank II teachers, those with master's degrees, is \$6,370-\$8,310. The county has 25 teachers in this category. Nicholas county has one teacher in Rank I which is master's degree plus 30 hours. This salary range is \$7,200 to \$8,900.  
These figures were released recently to the Kentucky Education Association (KEA) Research Unit publication, "Starting salaries this year for Kentucky's public-school classroom teachers with bachelor's degrees and no experience range from \$600 to \$7725, according to the publication.  
The publication, "Kentucky Public-School Teachers' Salary Schedules and Related Information, 1973-74," shows a minimum salary for teachers with a minimum salary system. The minimum of \$7725 for teachers with bachelor's degrees reported by the Knox county school system.  
KEA public relations and research director Charles Whaley said last year's scheduled salaries for beginning teachers with bachelor's degrees ranged from Knox county's \$5544 to Fort Thomas' \$7225.  
Most Kentucky teachers are in the Rank III category, which means they have a bachelor's degree. The state mandated minimum this year for Rank III teachers with no experience is \$7,730.

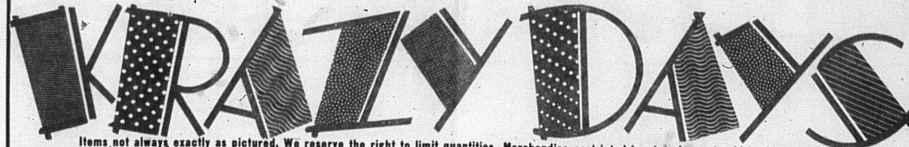
