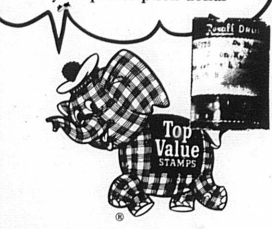

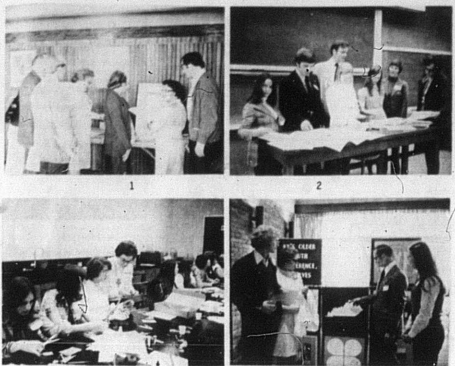

### Three senior citizen specials in November

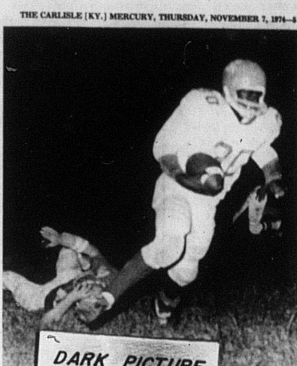
