### GI home loans

More GI home loans went to veterans and servicemen in August than during any August since 1962. Veterans Administration officials also said they expect generally high activity to continue in the months ahead.

There were 31,200 loans approved in August, a 20 per cent jump over July and a 32 per cent hike over August a year ago.

In the category of loan applications, it was reported that 22,000 were received in August. This was a 9 per cent gain over July and about even with August 1973. Approval requests totaled 47,200, roughly 3 per cent fewer than in both July this year and August a year ago.

Among reasons cited for the improved home loan outlook are recent announcements of drops in prime interest rates, and lowering of short-term interest rates after the Federal Reserve pumped more than \$1 billion into the money market.

VA officials observed that the federal Reserve also purchased Treasury bills for its own account. "These and related factors tend to make more money available, enabling banks and savings and loan associations to put more money into mortgage loans at lower interest rates," VA officials explained.

VA guarantees 60 per cent up to a maximum of \$12,500, whichever is less, of home loans private lenders make to eligible servicemen and veterans of World War II and later periods.
