

Xenia tornado special to be aired Oct. 10

The Xenia, Ohio tornado will be the subject of an NBC News special which airs Thursday, Oct. 10, at 8 p.m. EDT. The program will show footage of the funnel approaching Xenia and the devastation left by its 250-300 mph winds.


