Millersburg Military Institute commences 82nd year Sept. 3

Millersburg Military Institute in Millersburg, will initiate its 82nd year of continuous operation on Tuesday, September 6, 1971.

Cadet officers reported to campus on Monday, August 31, and will continue as usual to date. It is a non-profit institution, established in 1883 and continues as such to date. It is the only military school in the state of Kentucky and one of two remaining in operation in the three-state area of Kentucky, Ohio, and West Virginia. It also has a Junior ROTC Program which is sponsored by the U.S. Army.

Col. Joseph R. Johnson, who became the school's fifth superintendent in 1960, continues to operate this traditional college preparatory school for boys under the school's motto: "Right Training is Better Than Riches."

USDA's rural development provides various loans

Increasingly, people want to live and work in rural America, and rural people and communities are using more and more special loans from Agriculture (USDA) to improve living conditions and create employment opportunities. Will Erwin, assistant secretary of agriculture for rural development, said today:

"He pointed out that USDA's Farmers Home Administration provides the national pool of nearly \$3.6 billion in loans in rural development in fiscal year 1971 to help achieve these national goals:

- 1. More food and fiber for the nation.
- 2. 80,830 loans to help family farmers buy and operate farms, FARMIA made more than \$1 billion available to supplement regular commercial credit.
- 3. Improve rural housing: FHMIA advanced \$53.2 million in 1970-71 for rural residents of low or moderate income.
- 3. Moderate small towns and rural communities: FHMIA made 1,236 loans totaling nearly \$43 million to improve the water and waste disposal systems. Another 193 loans amounting to \$49.3 million were made for other essential community facilities.
