It gave rise to coffee shops and an early version of modern "coffee breaks" were being served in Europe.

In 1873, Charles II of England ordered that coffee houses be closed. The order was so strict that it contemplated the order 15 days later. A few years later, Scandinavia also tried prohibiting coffee. It was so strict that the order was rescinded and a tax placed on coffee instead.
