

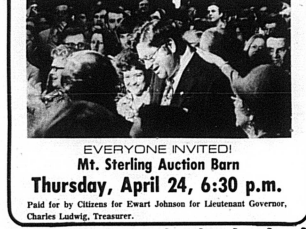

New candidate trust fund unveiled

Kelly Thompson Jr., democratic candidate for Clerk of the Court of Appeals, Friday unveiled a trust fund which he hopes will become a model for future campaign financing. For this trust, entitled Irrevocable Political Trust for the Benefit of Kelly Thompson Jr., names the Bowling Green Bank and Trust Company as trustee and was drafted by the law firm of Harlin, Parker, and Rudloff of Bowling Green. Under this Trust Agreement, Thompson will never receive a campaign contribution personally. All contributions for Thompson must be given to the trustee at the bank. This trustee may not pay anyone, including Thompson, a salary. Money within the trust may only be paid to third parties (i.e., radio, printing, etc.) for advertising expenses; and to third parties (oil credit/cards) for Thompson's traveling expenses while engaged in a campaign for public office. The trust remains in effect for Thompson's life or until he directs the trustee that he will no longer campaign for a public office. At that time any money in the trust becomes a charitable contribution to the College Heights Foundation at Western Kentucky University. Thompson is an attorney from Bowling Green. He is the only

Kay's Kitchen

In answer to requests for additional oven meal recipes, here is one that features round steak with a spicy flour of catsup, onion, onion, green pepper and a bit of clove. It can be put together the day before and refrigerated until time to bake. Allow more baking time if refrigerating before cooking. If there is extra space in the oven cook a casserole of mixed dried fruit to serve the next day. Normally we think of oven meals being served during the winter, but it is nice to have an oven cooked meal when you want to be out doing yard work, since once you get the meal in the oven it doesn't require watching.

BRAISED SPICY STEAK
1 1/2 pounds boneless round steak, about 1/2 inch thick
1 cup flour
1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons shortening
1 cup catsup
1 cup water
1 onion, sliced thinly
1 lemon, sliced thinly
1 green pepper, cut into rings
6 whole cloves

Cut steak into 6 pieces. Mix together flour, salt and pepper. Pound flour mixture into steak. Heat shortening in skillet; add steak brown on each side. Place in 9x13x2-inch baking pan. Combine catsup and water and pour over steak. Place a slice of onion, lemon and green pepper on each piece of steak; insert a clove in the center of each. Cover lightly with foil and bake in 350 degree oven for 50 minutes.

RICE IN CONSUMME
Place 1 cup converted rice in a 1 1/2 quart casserole. Mix together 1 (10 1/2 ounce) can beef consommé, 1 can water, 1 teaspoon salt and a dash of tobacco; pour over rice. Stir to mix. Cover and bake in 350 degree oven for 50 minutes.

GREEN BEANS AND ONION
Place 2 packages frozen cut green beans in a 1 1/2 quart casserole. Add 1 tablespoon instant chopped onion, 2 tablespoons butter, 1 teaspoon seasoned salt and 2 tablespoons water. Cover and bake in 350 degree oven for 50 minutes.

DATE-TOPPED CAKE
1 cup chopped dates
1 teaspoon soda
1/2 cup boiling water
1/2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
1 cup sugar
1 egg, beaten
1 tablespoon melted butter
1/2 cup chopped nuts
Fit and chop dates; dissolve soda in boiling water and pour over dates. Let stand. Combine flour, baking powder, salt and sugar, mixing well. Stir in dates, egg and butter. Blend thoroughly. Stir in nuts. Turn into greased, 8-inch square baking pan. Bake in 350 degree oven for 50 minutes. Meanwhile, make Date Topping: Combine 1 cup chopped dates, 1 cup sugar, 1/2 cup boiling water, dash salt and 1 cup chopped nuts, mixing well. Pour over cake as soon as it comes from oven. Let cake cool in pan. Makes 8 servings.
