Free medical attention offered

Children up to age 21 who are eligible for Medicaid can get free-of-charge medical attention at the Nicholas County Health Department, Highway 90K.

Through the Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment Program (EPSDT), available at local health departments or clinics, these children receive a complete examination for physical and mental problems from qualified health personnel.

In the Bluegrass region of Kentucky, 22 agencies in 17 counties have contracts with the Department for Human Resources (DHR) to conduct EPSDT clinics.

C. Leola Dawson, secretary of DHR, explained how EPSDT works: "While the department's Bureau for Social Insurance is responsible for the program's operation, the Bureau for Social Services workers, who are in close touch with all of our clients, refer individuals to the screening clinics, make appointments for them and make sure they have transportation to the clinic sites."

Children whose mothers receive Aid to Families with Dependent Children are automatically eligible for EPSDT services, Dawson said.

"The program makes health care available to people who cannot afford it. If the child needs follow-up care—such as a pair of glasses—he or she is referred to a practicing physician." In 1974, over half of the children screened needed follow-up attention.

Paris youth killed in Fayette auto accident

A 14-year-old Paris boy was killed in a traffic mishap on the Versailles Road west of Lexington on Tuesday morning, July 29.

Fayette County Coroner Chester Hager said the accident victim was Connie David Gilkinson Jr. of 243 Seventh Street, Paris. He said the boy was a passenger in a Southern Belle Dairy truck driven by Gary Neaves, 26, of the same Paris address. Neaves was admitted to the St. Joseph Hospital in Lexington, for injuries.

According to the coroner's report, the dairy truck for some reason swerved into the side of a tractor-trailer truck which was attempting to pass it. The dairy truck overturned, throwing the boy from the vehicle and pinning him underneath. He was apparently killed instantly.

A native of Paris, he was the grandson of James Honker, of Carlisle, and Mrs. Mary Honker, Cincinnati.
