- GREEN TOMATO PICKLE**
Take 4 quarts of green tomatoes, 4 small onions and 4 green peppers. Slice the tomatoes and onions thin. Sprinkle over them ½ cup coarse salt and leave overnight in a crock or enameled vessel. The next morning drain off the brine. Into a separate vessel put 1 quart vinegar, 1 level tablespoon each of black pepper, mustard seed, celery seed, cloves, allspice and cinnamon, and ½ cup sugar. Bring to a boil and then add the prepared tomatoes, onions, peppers. Let boil for 20 minutes. Put jars and seal white hot. For a better seal jars may be processed in hot water bath for 10 minutes.
- RETSAP** (Something Good)
1 quart apples
1 quart tomatoes
1 quart onions
1 quart peppers (green and red)
1 quart green tomatoes
1 quart vinegar
1 level tablespoon each of black pepper, mustard seed, celery seed, cloves, allspice and cinnamon, and ½ cup sugar. Bring to a boil and then add the prepared tomatoes, onions, peppers. Let boil for 20 minutes. Put jars and seal white hot. For a better seal jars may be processed in hot water bath for 10 minutes.
- SWEET MIXED PICKLES**
2 medium cauliflower
2 medium green peppers, cut into ½ inch cubes
2 medium sweet red peppers, cut into ½ inch cubes
9 medium onions, peeled and quartered
¾ cup white vinegar
1 ½ cups water
1 ½ cups sugar
Break cauliflower into small florets. Cut in small amount of unacidified boiling water for 5 minutes; drain. Wash and prepare remaining vegetables; set aside. Combine remaining ingredients in crock and heat to boiling. Add vegetables and hot, unacidified water. Boil for 20 minutes. Remove spice bag, filling to within 1/8 inch of top. Be sure vinegar solution covers
