Sucker control agent recalled

FRANKFORT—The pesticide office of the Kentucky Department for Natural Resources and Environmental Protection, in conjunction with the Anson Company, has announced a recall of Super-Sucker Stuff H.C., lots numbered 21 through 36 inclusively.

Super-Sucker Stuff H.C. is a systemic sucker control agent used in tobacco-growing areas.

All farmers, dealers, distributors and users are urged to check the cap of the product containers for a two-digit number that identifies the lot and return the product to its point of purchase.

According to Fred Waters, chief of the state pesticide agency, several reports have been received alleging that tobacco leaves have been burned by the product.

Waters said thousands of gallons of the defective lots may already be in the hands of farmers. "This being a critical time because farmers are now using the product, we have called a meeting with the manufacturers and dealers of Super-Sucker Stuff H.C.," he added. "We're making every effort to get this problem straightened out immediately. We want to find out what is wrong with this material and prevent any further damage."

Heavy rains and flash floods on Sunday afternoon caused extensive crop damage in many sections of the county. East Hill Naffziger, County Extension Agent, reported that tobacco crops appear to have been hit the hardest.
