

# Kay's Kitchen

For Labor Day would you use to eat out of doors, but building a barbecue fire takes too much time and effort? Well you can cook an easy meal and still eat out on the deck or your yard picnic table. If there is no picnic table use cardboard or let persons use a table. Bring the food out at serving time. Place on a few covered card table and let each one serve themselves buffet style.

2 tablespoons chopped green onion  
1 tablespoon chopped parsley  
1 tablespoon dry white wine  
Place meat in bowl, add seasoned salt, garlic salt and pepper sauce; mix well. Divide into eight portions. Shape each into a fat patty about 4 inches in diameter. Combine cheese, onion, parsley and wine. Spoon evenly over four patties. Place remaining four patties on top and pinch edges together to seal well. Place in baking pan. Bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes.

**CORN ON COB**  
4 large ears of corn  
1/2 cup water  
Halk ears and remove silk. Place ears in casserole; add water and corn. Bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes.

**BUTTERED PEAS**  
1 (10-ounce) package frozen peas  
1/2 tablespoon butter  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/4 cup water  
Place package of peas in 1 1/2-quart casserole. Add butter, salt and water. Cover and bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes.

**STUFFED HAMBURGERS**  
1 pound ground chuck  
1 pound seasoned salt  
1/2 teaspoon garlic salt  
1/8 teaspoon red pepper sauce or black pepper  
1 cup shredded American cheese

**BAKED PEARS**  
2 large fresh pears, you may use canned pears  
1/2 cup brown sugar, packed  
1 tablespoon flour  
1/8 teaspoon salt  
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon  
1/4 cup water  
1/2 cup brown lemon juice  
2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted  
Have pears, peel and core. Place in aluminum baking pan. Mix together sugar, flour, salt and cinnamon. Stir in water, lemon juice and butter. Spoon over pears. Cover with foil. Bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes with oven door open.

**FRENCH BREAD**  
Slice French loaf to bottom crust. Butter each slice and sprinkle with seasoned or garlic salt. Heat in toaster. Add butter, salt and water. Cover and bake in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes.
