What nicer way to say "Merry Christmas" to your neighbors or friends than to give them a delicious Christmas goodie. This week I'll give you recipes you can make now and that keep well. (If you can resist them.)

Last week I gave you the recipe for Pecan Cake. This makes a very large cake and you can cut wedges or slices for giving. Now here is a delicious cookie you can make now, store in the refrigerator, then slice when you want to. It makes two rolls and is much more in diameter than about 18 inches long. I keep these in my refrigerator the year round. So handy to slice a dozen or so cookies, place on cookie sheet and bake while the kettle boils for tea. You will find they are both ready about the same time.

DOUGH REFRIGERATOR COOKIES

- 1 cup shortening
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 egg
- 2 1/2 cups sifted flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- 1/2 cup finely chopped walnuts

Cream together shortening and sugars; add egg and beat well. Sift together dry ingredients; stir into creamed mixture. Add nuts. Shape into rolls on wax paper about 2 1/2 inches across. (These are larger cookies) than the "Ice Box Cookies". Wrap in wax paper and chill. Wrap again in aluminum foil if you are going to keep them very long. Slice very thin. Bake 1 inch apart on greased cookie sheet in moderate oven (375 degrees), 9 to 10 minutes or until lightly brown. Remove at once to rack.

ORANGE BALLS

- 1 1/2 cups package semi sweet chocolate morsels
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup light corn syrup
- 2 1/2 cups finely crushed vanilla wafer

Melt morsels in microwave oven or in top of double boiler. Add sugar and syrup. Stir until smooth. Add vanilla wafers. Press into balls. Roll in wax paper until coated. Refrigerate until firm.

Divide dough in half and roll in wax paper until about 1/2 inch thick. Push around. As you roll the dough, push and pull lengthwise. Wrap each roll in wax paper, then in aluminum foil and refrigerate until firm.

ready to use. Slice very thin, place on cookie sheet, not touching and bake in 375 degree oven. Watch closely. It doesn't take long and you do not want them brown—just around the edges and they are done.

CHERRY SALAD
1 can 400 crushed pineapple, well drained. (It is important to drain well to keep from being too.)
1/3 cup of whole cranberry sauce, 1 carton of sour cream.

Mix ingredients well and spoon into paper cups. Place that have been placed in muffin tin. Freeze when ready to serve. Remove from tins and place in plastic bag for easy storage. When ready to serve, peel paper from salad and serve on lobl lettuce topped with mayonnaise. Remember to get the salad out early enough so that it will not freeze too hard.
