

# Kay's Kitchen

Here are two candy pudding recipes. Both are good. The one you select will show how ambitious you are.

**CANDY PUDDING**  
1 pound confectioners sugar  
1 stick of butter (4 pounds)  
1 tablespoon cream or enough to handle easily  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
1 cup chopped nuts  
1 box of red and one box of green candied cherries  
Mix all ingredients and make into roll to slice. Store in refrigerator overnight before slicing.

**CANDY PUDDING**  
12 cups white sugar  
2 cups cream  
2 cans coconut  
1 cup nuts  
12 candied cherries  
12 dates

If the above is wanted in two colors—split recipe in half, and cook separately.

To white sugar add enough hot water to cover stirring with wooden spoon or finger thoroughly to make thick syrup. (Keep spoon out of mixture during cooking except for testing. Cook until syrup spins a hair. Then add cream, a little at a time—cook until a small soft ball can be formed in water. It's all in the cooking on the lid). Four units buttered "marble" slab, knead—if this batch is to be pink add coloring before creaming, then put in coconut and nuts. If at this point mixture should begin to crumble add 2 or more teaspoons of warm water and work thoroughly. Firm in loaf, add and finely chopped candied cherries to top. Slice.

**CHRISTMAS DESSERTS**  
All of these desserts are a collection of rich and tasty concoctions given to me by friends and relatives through the years. I have never seen any one of them in a cookbook, though they may be. Here are a couple that I can't easily prepare.

**FRENCH SLIK**  
Make a crust by combining the following ingredients and pat down both bottom and sides into a inch by 12 inch pan.  
1 cup brown sugar (loosely packed)

**PEPPERMINT MOUSSE**  
Whip 1 1/2 pints of heavy cream. Fold in 1 cup crushed peppermint sticks carefully. Add very, very slowly 1 cup of green cream of tartar and 1 ounce white cream of meringue. Lately and slowly 1 tablespoon sugar. (The recipe did not say but I always have used confectioners sugar.) Chill very thoroughly and serve in small sherbet glasses. With this dessert I serve the pills and dinner black coffee.

**CHRISTMAS Mousse**  
Melt 1 pound semi-sweet chocolate with 2 tablespoons of water over hot water. When melted, cool and add 1 teaspoon of rum and the beaten yolks of three eggs. (Beat yolks until light in color.) Fold all into the stiffly beaten whites to which you have added 4 tablespoons of sugar. Spoon into small glasses or sherbet glasses and refrigerate overnight. Serve garnished with whipped cream and topped with maraschino cherry.

Here is a recipe to save and to serve when you want a dessert for a very special occasion. This dessert was one of the most popular numbers on the menu of the superintendent, United States Bank in 1954. My mother and sister, who were aboard her that year, brought the recipe back to me. It was listed on the menu as Peppermint Mousse United States. Now I just call it: United States.
