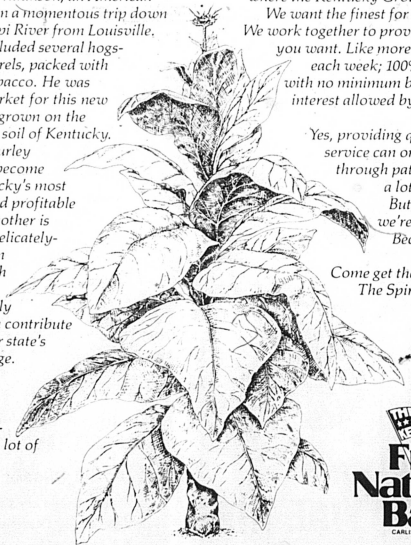


# Tobacco helps shape the Spirit of Kentucky.

## U.S. Naval Academy begins 130th year

The U.S. Naval Academy, located on the banks of the Severn River in Annapolis, Md., has begun its 130th year.

The yard, as the main campus area is called, remains steeped in tradition while the academic education and professional training has moved forward to keep pace with the needs of the nuclear-age Navy.

Where 15 years ago all midshipmen took the same 60-course curriculum, midshipmen of today choose from a variety of majors and more than 500 courses. The 4,000 midshipmen attend

classes ranging from aerospace engineering to operations analysis, oceanography, economics and international security affairs.

This year's Plebe, or Freshman Class includes many of the nation's most distinguished high school graduates. Nearly 1,300 new midshipmen were selected from more than 6,700 candidates for admission.

Producing career Navy and Marine Corps officers remains the prime mission of the Naval Academy. Midshipmen receive professional training in Annapolis during the academic year and during interlocking summers when they train aboard ships of the fleet. Upon graduation from Annapolis, midshipmen receive B.S. degrees and commissions as ensigns in the Navy or second lieutenants in the Marine Corps. COOKIES AND CANAPÉS  
FOR CHRISTMAS

**CHOCOLATE BUTTER COOKIES**

- 12 small Bixies or 12 ginger Snakes
- 1/2 cup butter
- 2/3 cups sifted flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 cup (1 stick) butter
- 1/2 cup finely packed brown sugar
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 teaspoon hot water
- 1 teaspoon vinegar

Sift flour with rest of the dry ingredients. Cream butter and sugar. Add molasses, egg and beat until smooth. Fold in sifted dry ingredients. Add water, vinegar and blend. Cover dough and chill for at least 2 hours. Roll out on lightly floured board to 1/4-inch thickness and cut with cookie cutters. Excellent for Christmas shapes. Place on buttered cookie sheets and bake 15-20 minutes. Remove from oven. Transfer cookies to cake rack to cool. Frost or decorate as desired.

**FLORENTINES**

Mix thoroughly:

- 1/2 cup whipping cream
- 3 tablespoons sugar

Sift in:

- 1/2 cup sliced almonds
- 1/2 cup ground orange peel
- 1/2 cup sifted confectioner's sugar

Spread cookie sheet with unsalted butter. Drop batter from teaspoon well apart. Bake until brown — about 10 to 15 minutes. Watch carefully. When cool, dip in melted semi-sweet chocolate by placing cookies on picks. Makes about 30 very thin 3-inch cookies. Bake at 350.

**CHEESE PUFFS (hot)**

Beat until stiff:

- 2 egg whites
- 1/2 cup grated CHEDDAR CHEESE
- 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

Frost on one side, small rounds of bread. Spread unseasoned side with mixture and place under broiler for 5 or 6 minutes until cheese is puffed and brown. May be made on crackers.

**SHRIMP PUFFS**

Whip until stiff:

- 2 egg whites
- 1/2 cup GRATED CHEESE
- 1/2 cup finely chopped shrimp
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise

Mix mixture lightly on crackers, melba or plain toast rounds. Garnish with 1/2 shrimp per lengthwise, and broil until lightly brown. Makes about 32.
