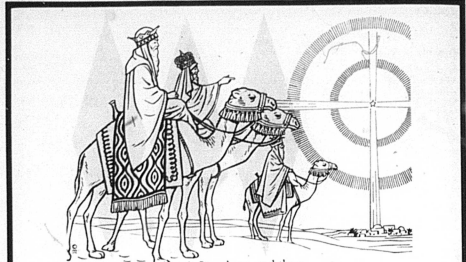


SANTA LETTERS

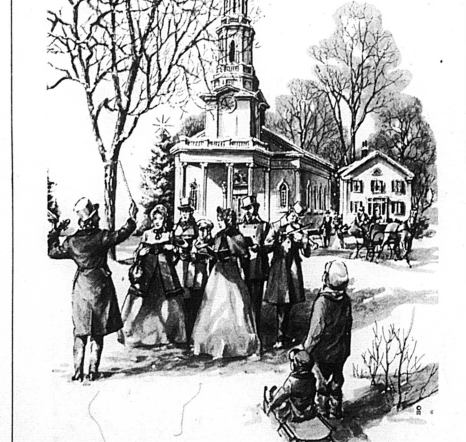

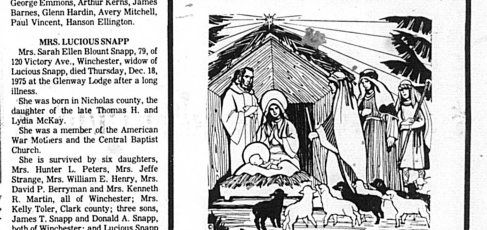
Obituaries
