Rib roast: a holiday classic

Traditions from around the world meet in a classic British delight for accompanied by light frothy Yorkshire pudding—will crown any festive table with elegance.

Despite its regal appearance, rib roast is easy to prepare and select if you use tips from the U.S. Department of Agriculture.
Look for the USDA quality grade, which, a reliable guide to the roaster's tenderness, juiciness and flavor. USDA Prime is the highest grade of beef followed by USDA Choice, the grade most commonly found in retail stores, and USDA good, is somewhat leaner than the higher grades.

When buying rib roast—sometimes labeled standing rib or prime rib—allow at least half a pound per person for an average serving. For holiday meals and hearty appetites, you may want a pound per person. This roast goes from refrigerator to table with little ado. Rib roasts shouldn't be seared before roasting. Just use an open roasting pan with no water and keep the oven at a constant low to moderate temperature of 325 degrees.

As a general guide to cooking time, allow about 24 minutes per pound for a rare rib roast, 28 minutes per pound for medium, and 32 minutes per pound for well-done. Then, to be sure your beef will be just the way you like it, use a meat thermometer.
Insert the thermometer into the center of the large ribeye muscle. For a rare roast the internal temperature should be 140 degrees, medium—160 degrees, and well-done—170 degrees. But don't keep it in the oven quite that long. Remove the roast when the thermometer registers five degrees lower than the desired degrees.
