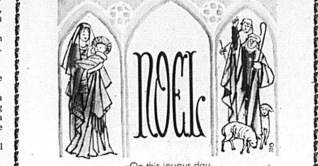

Milk production and prices to rise

U.S. milk production in the first half of 1975 could be up about one percent from year-earlier levels while retail prices will also continue to rise, according to a report issued by the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA). "The Dairy Situation" points out that heavier concentrate and grain feeding, resulting from substantially lower feed prices, should continue to increase per cow output. In October, retail butter prices approached \$1.15 per pound (up 20 cents from year-earlier levels) and fluid milk hit about 79 cents per half-gallon, up one cent from October 1974. Retail dairy prices will probably continue to rise through early 1976 since the price of butter and cheese to consumers is only just now starting to reflect the full impact of past rises in the wholesale markets. Wholesale prices of milk for fluid use are still rising and likely will peak in the first quarter of 1976. The higher wholesale prices in late 1975 were a result of tight supplies and relatively strong consumer demand. Farm milk prices hit \$10 per hundred pounds in November, up more than \$2 from last June, while manufacturing milk prices were more than \$1 above the current support price. Wholesale dairy prices likely will decline in early 1976 as supplies of milk available for manufacturing are expected to exceed this year's levels.
