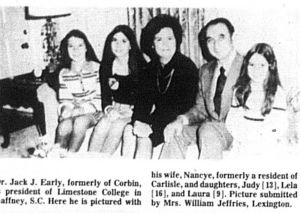

The Nicholas County squad, carrying a season record of seven wins and ten losses into the tourney, came up short handed in the third and fourth quarters after playing right with Scott County at the outset of the game. The young netters couldn't seem to hold a drive together long enough to take the lead position from the Scott County team, and they were forced into the role of playing catch up ball throughout the main duration of the contest.

The Scott County Cardinals banged out in front of the Jackets by a 6-0 score in the opening minutes of the game before James Anderson's basket gave the Nicholas County team a score. Then Mike Berry's tally gave the Jackets a chance to break out in the lead for the first time in the half game during their next trip down court. But Scott County broke out to a 9-4 lead at that point and threatened to make the margin more. But Mark Vice came through for Scott County and pulled the Jackets to within three at 6-9. Billy Minton then reduced the Cardinal margin to a single point, 9-8, with his score. Scott County ended the first quarter on a foul shot and sat on top of a 10-8 lead at the end of the period.

Scott County immediately scored in the second quarter on a tip off play and they hit another basket before Mark Ruddle finally broke ice for the Nicholas County team. Ruddle hit another shot to pull the score to 17-12. Mike Berry then hit one to bring the score to 22-14 after a foul in Jacket scoring. Mark Vice hit the final basket of the second quarter making it 26-18 in favor of Scott County.

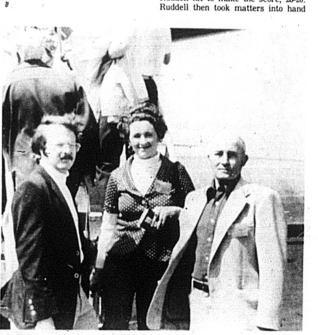
