

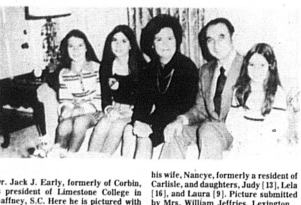

Sheep profit day

The seventh annual Sheep Profit Day, a program for Kentucky sheep producers, will take place on March 7. The event will be held in the Carthage House on the University of Kentucky's Coldestream Farm, which is located on Newsum Pike between New Circle and 1-75 north of Lexington.

The program will begin at 9:30 a.m. Dr. Donald Ely, Associate Professor of Animal Sciences at UK, will discuss various forages for sheep and show how the quality of forages affects their feeding value. Dr. Charles Parker, Extension sheep specialist at UK, will talk about the current economic outlook in sheep production.

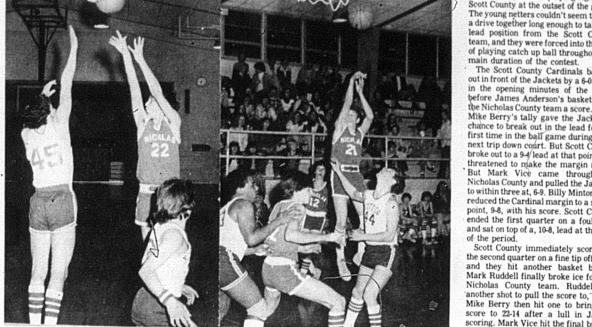
