care for her invalid father. After his death, she was elected to the General Assembly for four consecutive terms, and during this time she cared for her aged mother until her death.

Mrs. McNamara attended Morehead State University, and received her B.S. and M.A. degrees from Eastern University, being the first person to receive both degrees from Eastern. She did graduate study at the University of Kentucky.

During her 18 years as superintendent, new buildings were constructed at Grass Lake and Willoughby, the stone building and gymnasium at Canawon, graded and high school was opened, where a high school was opened for pupils in the county other than those attending Canawon High. Many other improvements were made in the fifteen million seven hundred thousand more dollars in teacher salaries and retirement. In 1971 Special Session, she sponsored two important resolutions. In her four Regular Sessions and two Special Sessions of the General Assembly, Mrs. McNamara served on eight committees and was chairman of the Elections Committee. TOP HAT COOKIES
1/2 cup firmly packed butter
1/2 cup granulated sugar
1/2 cup whipping vanilla
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
1/2 cup quick or old fashioned oats, uncooked
1/2 cup miniature marshmallows
2 large marshmallows, cut in half
1/8 in. chocolate bars, cut into 34 pieces

Heat oven to moderate (375 degrees F). Beat together butter, sugar, vanilla, salt and egg until thoroughly blended. Add flour, mix until well blended. Stir in oats. Drop by teaspoons onto greased cookie sheets. Bake in preheated oven 12 to 15 minutes. Makes 24 dozen cookies.

HONEY NUT OATMEAL DROPS
1/2 cup butter or margarine
1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
1/2 cup honey
1 egg
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 cup sifted all-purpose flour
1/2 teaspoon soda
1/2 cup quick or old fashioned oats, uncooked
1/2 cup chopped nuts

Heat oven to moderate (350 degrees F). Beat butter until fluffy. Gradually add brown sugar. Beat in honey, egg and vanilla. Stir together flour, soda and salt. Add to creamed mixture alternately with nuts. Stir in oats and nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto lightly greased cookie sheets. Bake in preheated oven 12 to 15 minutes. Makes 34 dozen cookies.
