## USDA announces milk support price increase

Secretary of Agriculture, Earl L. Butz, has announced that the support price for manufacturing milk will be increased from \$2.37 to \$2.24 per hundredweight. The increase is effective immediately and will remain in effect through this marketing year and the next marketing year which ends March 31, 1975. The new level of support is 80 percent of parity, based on the most current parity data, compiled as of Dec. 15, 1974.

Secretary Butz said this action is necessary because farm milk prices have declined while costs have remained at high levels. The prices farmers received for milk were substantially lower in December than in November, the first monthly decline since last summer. Without this action, the Secretary said prices would have dropped even further in the next month or two, the very time when producers must feed greater quantities of grain and high priced commercially prepared concentrate feeds. Under these conditions, many producers would have left dairying and the future production of milk and dairy products would have declined.

## Extension specialists to speak here Jan. 23

Managing Your Money and Using Credit Wisely, are the topics to be discussed by Helen Stevens and Steve Allen, Extension Specialists, University of Kentucky, Thursday, Jan. 23 at 1:30 p.m., Little Court House, Nicholas County Court House.

The discussion will include topics on making a spending plan, looking for changes that can be made (whether curbing spending or setting priorities); how to figure credit cost, major sources of agricultural credit and credit rating.

This program is sponsored by the County Extension Council and is open to anyone regardless of race, color, sex or national origin.

## Fertilizer shortage hinges on natural gas availability

Unless supplies of natural gas are made available soon, there will be an acute shortage of fertilizer this spring with resulting higher food prices, says John J. Feland, general manager of Southern States Cooperative, Southern States is a major fertilizer manufacturer and distributor in a five-state area, supplying about 25% of the fertilizer tonnage used in Kentucky. The warning came on the heels of an announcement that Farmers Chemical Company's large nitrogen manufacturing plant at South Point, Ohio, has been shut down due to a shortage of natural gas. He cited Senate Resolution No. 80 which directed that "The Federal Power Commission and appropriate state regulatory agencies do everything within their power, in the establishment of priorities for the allocation of natural gas... to insure producers... with supplies of natural gas sufficient to maintain maximum production levels."

"What is needed is immediate action by Congress and the Federal Power Commission to make good on government pledges made earlier to the effect that farmers should have the fuel and fertilizer they need to produce the food that's needed," the co-official declared.
