Sen. Ward campaigns in Western Kentucky

Senator Tom Ward (D-Versailles) brought his campaign for Lieutenant Governor to Western Kentucky recently.
Ward spoke at a public reception sponsored by local educators and area supporters of his candidacy. The meeting was held at Gabe's Restaurant in Owensboro.
Senator Ward called for state recognition of the crisis situation in our schools. "I would, as vice-chairman of the Senate Education Committee, said 'Kentucky's poorly financed schools cannot adequately provide the state's students for the future. This is serving to worsen the already desperate economic situation. Without better public education and vocational training, unemployment will continue to run rampant in the Commonwealth.'
He expressed dismay at Kentucky being ranked 48th in per pupil spending for state public primary and secondary schools.
Senator Ward pledged to make education a top priority for state support, saying, "The time has come for Kentucky to make up to the barn that we are doing our state by providing for an adequate system of
