U of L receives over \$3 million grant

It was announced recently that the University of Louisville Cancer Center has received a grant of \$3,776,710 from the Division of Cancer Control and Rehabilitation of the National Cancer Institute. The grant, which is allocated for a three year period, will be used to develop a comprehensive program designed to reduce chemical exposure related injury in industrial workers.
The new program will serve as a demonstration model throughout the nation as well as the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the application of the most updated methods of detection, prevention, therapy and rehabilitation in cancer control.
It will have an overall objective of providing out-patient laboratory testing for present and former B.F. Goodrich employees at the Louisville plant.
