FRANKFORT—The Administrative Register, a monthly publication of the Legislative Research Commission, is a very important document that the general public knows little about. All administrative regulations published by various departments of state government to implement and explain Kentucky Statutes are published in the Register after they are submitted to LRC. Then the Administrative Regulations Review Subcommittee studies them before being approved or rejected, or sent back to the agency with recommendations for change. What the public doesn't generally know is that more law is written by regulation than is passed by the legislature, although the regulations do spell out how laws are administered. The 1974 General Assembly passed a bill requiring that all administrative regulations had to be rewritten by July 1 this year or they would become void. Regulations, sometimes conflicting, had piled up over the years and many were obsolete. The regulations are first published in the Register to notify interested parties in the public so they can appear before the subcommittee meeting for hearings.
