Cars damaged in accidents

Nicholas County Sheriff Heese Smoot reported three auto accidents, which occurred last week.

Municipal aid program

FRANKFORT—Governor Julian M. Carroll and Transportation Secretary John C. Roberts today announced the 1975-76 Municipal Aid Program for the City of Carleble. The program is based on an anticipated allotment of \$6,107 for the coming fiscal year.

The program provides for blacktop resurfacing for Catherine Street, Kennedy Heights Road, and Morgan Street.

The activities authorized will be accomplished by the city with the Bureau of Highways financing all or a portion of the work in accordance with the Municipal Aid Agreement.

The Municipal Aid Program, which became effective July 1, 1973, is supported by a one-half cent per gallon gasoline tax. The funds derived from this tax are distributed among the incorporated and unincorporated areas according to the terms of a formula chosen by the General Assembly in 1972.

The program is selected annually after consultation with the city and urban areas. A formal agreement has been signed by officials acting for each party.
