Kay's Kitchen

Now is the time to think of cool and frosty drinks or desserts. In fact you could serve an all-iced dinner! Your main course may be a congealed ham salad, made the day before.

- CONGEALED HAM SALAD 1 tablespoon gelatin 1/2 cup cold water 1 chicken bouillon cube dissolved in 1 cup boiling water 1/2 cup mayonnaise 1/2 cup finely diced celery 1/2 cup sliced pickle relish 1/2 cup diced canned pimiento 1 cup cooked ham, diced Soften gelatin in cold water about five minutes; add hot bouillon and stir until dissolved. Chill until slightly thickened; mix in mayonnaise and then fold in remaining ingredients. Pour into mold and chill until firm. Serve with sauce. You might like to make it as individual molds or custard cups.

PEACH JULIP 1 can (16 oz.) peach slices 2 tablespoons cornstarch 1 teaspoon grated lemon rind 2 drops green food coloring, or pale yellow of the same color 2 drops mint extract 1 quart vanilla ice cream 1 cup mint sprigs, optional Drain peaches well, reserving syrup. Combine peach syrup, cornstarch, salt, and lemon rind. Cook, stirring until thickened and clear. 1 sometimes add the juice of one lemon at this stage. Taste to see if the sauce is to your liking. Stir in food coloring, mint extract, and

POACH SLICES. Chill. Layer ice cream and peach mixture in tall parfait glasses to serve. Garnish with mint sprigs, if desired. Makes 8 to 10 servings. This is a good parfait to serve if your parfait glasses are the large size.

QUICKIES Make a pretty dessert or salad by adding canned cling peach slices and chopped maraschino cherries to cherry gelatin. Chill and decorate with whipped cream. Be sure to use the fruit syrup for part of the liquid in gelatin mixture.

FROSTED CRANBERRY SHRUB 1 cup cranberry juice 1/2 cup pineapple juice 2 tablespoons lemon juice 1 cup sugar 1/2 cup water Combine fruit juices and chill thoroughly. Just before serving, add ginger ale. Pour into chilled glasses. Garnish with mint sprigs. Serve immediately. Serves 6.
