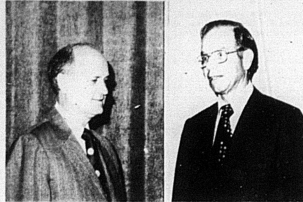


**Public education the subject**

**Organizations to meet to restore values**

The Alliance Conference Grounds on the Monterey Peninsula in California will be the scene of meetings held by two organizations that are both concerned with restoring moral and spiritual values to public school education.

The National Educators Fellowship national convention will be held Aug. 4 through 8. Some of the speakers are Henry Meyers, father of Pasadena's world famous "Fundamental Schools" and advocate of a return to the basics of fundamental education; Nancy Stake, the one-mother crusader who battled for the Creation account in California's largest school district; Maria Anne Hershmann, author of Hamsi; Mrs. Mell Gabler, one of America's top authorities on textbook content, plus other outstanding speakers. One of the music features will be the "Sunday Night Singers" considered the finest singing group on the coast. An optional college credit course will be offered entitled "Education's Christian Heritage." The many helpful workshops will include one on "The Value of Released Time Religious Education classes to the teacher and the child in public school."

The National Educators Fellowship is the only national organization of Christian public school teachers and administrators which uphold Christ and meet in His name.

**THE IMPORTANCE OF AGRICULTURAL EXPORTS**

One of this nation's greatest concerns in recent years has been trade deficits caused by the outflow of dollars to the petroleum exporting countries. How can we offset these deficits?

One of the best ways is through agricultural exports, which can substantially offset the trade deficit created by the rise in fuel imports.

Despite the balance of payments problems created by higher oil prices and sluggish economic activity around the world in the last half of 1974, U.S. farm exports were at a record-breaking level of \$22 billion last year—20 percent from 1973 in terms of value.

Nearly 17 percent of the \$4.9 billion increase in exports resulted from increased shipments to members of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).

U.S. agricultural exports to OPEC were almost \$1.6 billion—double the 1973 level. This was made possible, of course, by increased wealth from oil exports.

Even to non-OPEC developing countries, our exports were up \$1.2 billion or 41 percent. This accounted for 30 percent of the increase in U.S. farm exports.

To help meet the increase in world demand, the United States is better endowed with resources for agriculture.

son's life. I believe he is exposed to unnumbered "bells" in this world, as well as school, and all too many that haven't real answers. He has gained a greater understanding of human nature and has come to know himself better, thus developing him into the person he was meant to be. Instead of being defeated by mistakes or having himself for his "natural" instincts, he has found the peace of mind the Bible offers through the love of God in Jesus. Released Time is the arrangement whereby students, with parents permission, may be released for part of the school day to attend classes of religious and moral instruction. The program is not sponsored by the school and must be conducted off school property. One or more recognized religious groups may offer classes and each group is listed on a registration card distributed to each student. Parents who wish their child to attend indicate their choice on the card, which is then returned to the school. All students enrolled are released from their respective escorts at the place designated by the principal and are walked or driven to their particular class in a home, church or classroom trailer near the school.

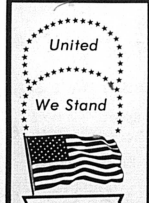
In 1952 the U.S. Supreme Court established the legality of the Released Time program in the *Zorach Case*. Justice William O. Douglas stated, "We are a religious people whose institutions presuppose a Supreme Being. We guarantee the freedom of worship as one chooses... when the state encourages religious instruction or cooperates with religious authorities by adjusting the schedule of public events to sectarian needs, it follows the best of our traditions."

A spokesman for Americans United for Separation of Church and State said "The 'Released Time' programs occur in one out of every six U.S. school districts." Released Time began in 1911 in the state of Indiana. A brother in Sacramento, Calif. wrote as follows: "These classes have become a very important part of my

cultural production than any other country. With only seven percent of the world's land mass we have more than 12 percent of the cultivated land and nearly nine percent of the pastureland.
