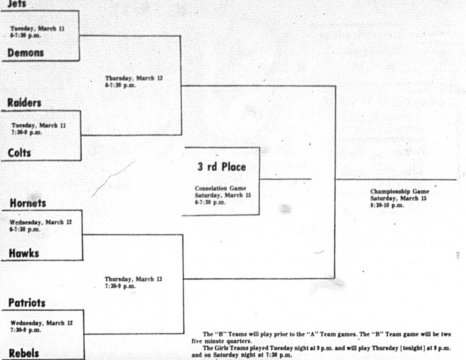

Nicholas County's Varsity girls basketball team went into action in the district tournament Friday night with hopes of having a better outcome than did the boys team on Tuesday. But the case was just the opposite, as the squad was completely shut out in the second quarter after only having scored four points in the first period. Harrison County's team won their right to play Paris in the finals by their overwhelming defeat of the Jackets. The Nicholas County squad had dwindled from a potential 36 at the beginning of the year, to only eight players. Harrison County began the game with a quick four point run before Joan Massey could hit for the Jackets. Harrison used the same tactics as had Paris against the Jacket boys team, which was to go inside. Harrison did this with continued authority and lead the Jackets at the end of the first half by ten points, 14-4. The second quarter was unbelievably dismal for Nicholas County as the team failed to hit the basket once for a score while Harrison added 12 points to their lead and ended the first half, 36-4.

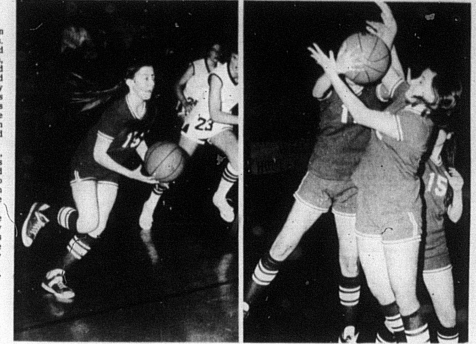
A total of 2,713,975 pounds of burley tobacco was taken under price support during the 1974-75 marketing season by the growers' associations administered by the support program in the eight-state burley belt.

The Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association, which handles price support operations in Kentucky, Ohio, Indiana, West Virginia and Missouri, received a total of 2,550,498 pounds, or about 14 of one per cent of sales at markets in those states. The Burley Co-Op has headquarters in Lexington.

Burley Stabilization Corp., of Knoxville, Tenn., which administers the program in Tennessee, North Carolina and Virginia, took a total of 68,477 pounds of burley—about .3 of one per cent of marketings in that area.

Alvin K. Beckley, executive secretary, said the Burley Co-Op's take included some tobacco from all of the 106 burley grades, but the heaviest receipts came from among lower quality leaf grades and nondescript-grade offerings.

Beckley noted that it's burley taken from the 1974 crop already had been handled in processed-strip form and offered to unit pricing and eventual sale to the trade. The current receipts represent the only unprocessed burley in the Co-Op's stocks. All holdings from previous crops have been sold or committed on deferred sales.
