Kay's Kitchen

One of my most helpful readers, Mrs. Adela C. O'Leary of Louisville, always seems to know when I need help. Several weeks ago, "out" I published last week, named it "Strawberry Quicks" dessert I published last week, named it "Strawberry Brere". In the same letter she asked if I had a certain recipe, and when I replied no, she immediately sent that one and two others. You will be seeing them here, if you are observing Lent and the tuna and other fish are beginning to pull, why not try eggs as your main dish. Egg omelets are good, and may be served plain or with a variety of fillings which give the omelet more body. You add the filling when the omelet is done and ready to fold in half.

You do not need a fancy omelet pan. Use a 10-inch iron skillet. I do think a heavy pan is necessary. Here is the basic recipe which will make four. It is easily doubled and the fillings and perhaps a sauce the omelet will stretch the portion.

FLUFFY OMELET
4 eggs, separated
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
dash of pepper
1 tablespoon butter
Beat egg yolks until thick and light; add seasonings, baking powder and milk. Fold stiffly beaten egg whites. Turn into hot buttered 10-inch skillet. Cook over low heat for 3 1/2 minutes, or until omelet puffs up and is light brown on the bottom. Place on a plate.

GRATED CHEESE OR SWISS CHEESE
Asparagus and hollandaise sauce, hot sweet crostons, served with mushroom sauce.

BAKED EGGS IN MACARONI
1 tablespoon butter
1 tablespoon oil
1 cup milk
1/4 cup grated cheese
1/2 teaspoon pepper
2 cups hot cooked macaroni
4 or more eggs, depending on size of servings—one egg per serving.
Melt butter and stir in flour; gradually add milk and cook 3 minutes, stirring until smooth and thickened. Add cheese and seasonings, and cook 2 minutes. Carefully break 6 eggs over the mixture. Pour over the egg a cup of cream and sprinkle with salt and pepper.

Here is a recipe that I have had several requests for because it is so easy to make and is good.

ORANGE-JELLO SALAD
Combine the following ingredients: 1 package of orange gelatin, 1 No. 1 can crushed pineapple, drained, 2 cups cream, cottage cheese and 1 small container of prepared whipped cream. Chill overnight. You do not add any water to the gelatin.—Mrs. Darrell Seiffers.

BAKED EGGS WITH CHEESE
Cover the bottom of a baking dish with about 1/2 pound of grated cheddar cheese. Combine and pour over the cheese 1/2 cup evaporated milk, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, a dash of hot Worcestershire sauce. Carefully break 6 eggs over the mixture. Pour over the egg a cup of cream and sprinkle with salt and pepper.
