with respect to eligibility of tobacco for price support. (1) As a condition of eligibility, producers will be required to certify that they have not used pesticide products containing Toxaphene and Dieldrin as well as DDT and TOX in the 1975 tobacco crops. Previously, the required certifications have not included Toxaphene and Dieldrin. (2) Fluorocured tobacco producers will not be required to certify their planted acreage, as they were under past programs.

As required by law, price support will be made available on the 1975 crop of various kinds of eligible tobacco at levels about 12 percent higher than last year. Under the proposals announced last week, the method of supporting tobacco will continue to be through loans on all eligible kinds of tobacco made to producer associations (and through purchase of Puerto Rican tobacco).


