TOBACCO AMENDMENT
FACES LONG ROAD TO SUCCESS
We have passed an emergency farm bill in the Senate which includes an increase in the support price for tobacco to 70 percent of parity. This would mean a support price of approximately \$1.12 for leaf and \$1.04 for flue-cured tobacco for the 1975 marketing season. In order to pass this legislation, we had to defeat three amendments offered by anti-tobacco senators. The amendments and the votes were: 20-26 against an amendment to completely eliminate the tobacco price support program; 6-32 against an amendment to increase the program; and 48-52 against an amendment to kill my amendment providing for the support price increase.
