



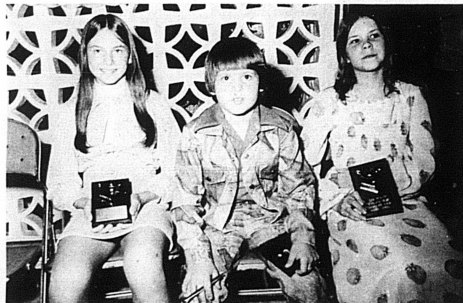

**Soil Stewardship Week May 4-11**

Soil Stewardship Week, a nationwide observance which emphasizes man's responsibility to protect and conserve soil, water, and other natural resources, will be May 4-11 this year. Edgar Allen Darrell, Chairman of the Nicholas County Conservation District, announced Wednesday that the "Test of Strength" emphasizes how the nation "lets our strength" and affect our continuing responsibility to be good stewards of the land. The District has provided local churches with programs, bulletin inserts, and copies of this year's observance booklet. The material was prepared by the National Soil Stewardship Advisory Committee of the National Association of Conservation Districts. The advisory committee is composed of churchmen of different faiths. Members of the Nicholas County Conservation District Board of Supervisors are: Edgar Allen Darrell, Lovell Hollar, Howard Sidle, Fred Whaley, Stanley C. Alexander, Ralph Brooks, and Wm. M. Young, Jr. The Board cited food and energy shortages, environmental pollution, and the growing concern over land use as examples of changes and development affecting the use of America's natural resources. "We hope," said Mr. Darrell, "that during Soil Stewardship Week, millions of Americans will pause for a moment to consider their responsibilities for the protection and use of the Lord's earth."
