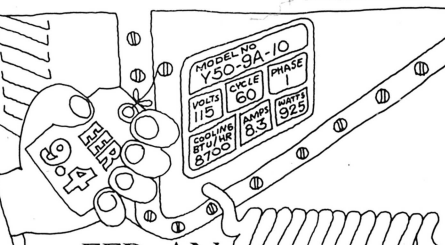

EER. AN AIR CONDITIONER'S HIDDEN COST TAG.

Not all air conditioners are the same. Some use 40% to 50% less electricity than others to do the same amount of cooling.

To make sure the air conditioner you buy will cost less to operate you need to determine its Energy Efficiency Ratio... the EER. The higher the EER, the better.

Some manufacturers attach a special EER tag to their units. Look for the unit with the highest number on its tag. But, if there is no tag, you can easily calculate the EER from the information on the name plate attached to the back of every air conditioner.

To figure the EER, divide the number of watts into the number of BTUs. The EER of an 8700 BTU unit having a metal plate like the one illustrated here would look like this:

EER: The bigger the number, the less need for electricity.

We recommend an EER of 8 or more. A higher EER will help you heat the heat while you save valuable electricity. And that's a cool way to conserve energy and save money.
