Ten Danger Signals in Buying
Each year there seems to be an increase in "door to door" selling as warm weather arrives. This is also the time of year when many families are "caught-up" in the excitement of planning home repairs, home improvements and new home furnishings; therefore, they may be less likely to select false or deceptive practices used by sales-people who approach them.

There is an excellent leaflet entitled, "Ten Danger Signals in Buying." Here is an excerpt from this publication:

1. **Bait and Switch Selling:** Maybe planning home repairs, home improvements and new home furnishings; therefore, they may be less likely to select false or deceptive practices used by sales-people who approach them.

2. **Get Quick Kick Schemes:** If you are told you can make fabulous earnings, fast—be aware! Don't make any investment until you investigate those earnings claims to discover if such earnings are realistic.

3. **Oral Guarantees:** With guarantees, the seller is legally bound by a written contract says—and not what a salesperson tells you. Don't accept any oral guarantees. Get everything in writing! Be sure you understand what the guarantee means, what is covered by the guarantee, and how long you are protected.

4. **Oral Estimates:** As with guarantees, get estimates in writing. If you are having an appliance, radio or TV set taken from your home for repairs, first get a written estimate of the probable repair cost. In addition, get a written assurance that no additional work will be done (or additional charges made) without your consent. Remember, estimates that you are given a general idea of what it may cost for service or repairs, and they may be substantially less than the actual cost. To be safe, obtain several estimates and do not accept an unusually low estimate.

5. **Golden Opportunity:** Don't allow yourself to be rushed into buying something because it's a once-in-a-lifetime, last chance, or golden opportunity to get in on a good thing. You're probably the "last chance" the salesperson has to make the sale. Take your time and comparison shop before buying.

6. **Blank Contracts and Blank Checks:** Never, never sign a contract with blank spaces in it. Fill all blanks in with "X's." Never sign a statement which states that work is finished until it actually is. And, of course, never sign a blank check in which the amount is not written. Whenever you leave a blank, you run the possibility of having signed something which can be made to require you to pay more, sooner, or to someone other than you expected.

7. **You've Been Specially Selected:** If you are told you are getting a "special deal" and that few others have this chance, be skeptical. Ask yourself why someone is offering you such a special bargain. Ask the salesperson how many others were specially selected. Find out if your neighbors or co-workers were also "specially

selected?" Intended. Don't be tricked by this tactic. Read the entire contract, front and back, including the finest print. If you don't understand a contract, take it to someone who will explain it to you before you sign it. 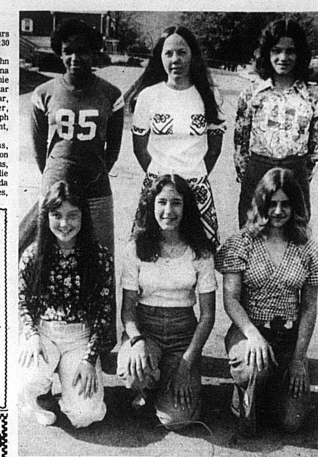
