Jefferson Davis plaque to be dedicated on June 3 in Frankfort

On Jefferson Davis' birthday, June 3, 1875, the Kentucky Division United Daughters of the Confederacy will salute the American Bicentennial Commemoration of the men and events that made this country a great nation by dedicating a plaque on the steps of Jefferson Davis in the Rotunda of the State Capitol Building in Frankfort. This plaque delineates the contribution made to the United States

Government of 37 years of his life together with his four years service to the Confederate States of America as its only president. No one has contributed more militarily and administratively toward the maintenance and development of our Nation than he did. This event will take place in the Rotunda at 3 p.m. in the afternoon on Tuesday, June 3, with Ex-Governor A. B. Chandler making the dedicatory address. Every UDC and SCV member and every Kentuckian should be proud of this recognition of one who has long been ignored. All members are expected to be present and to urge all friends to attend.

The United States Government is indebted to Jefferson Davis for the following services:
—Distinguished service in the Black Hawk War.
—Valiant service in the Mexican War; displayed unusual bravery at Monterey. Introduced strategic maneuver to win battle of Buena Vista where he was wounded. Scaled the walls of Mexico City.
—U.S. Senator from Mississippi under President Buchanan.
—Exhibited brilliant genius as

Secretary of War under President Pierce. Enlarged U.S. Army by four Regiments; organized Cavalry service adapted to needs of the nation; had funds repaired and rebuilt; strengthened forts on Western frontier; often withdrawing supplies from the South arsenals to accomplish it.
—Responsible for "Armored Victory" on the Capitol dome wearing eagle feathers instead of a pagan goddess con.

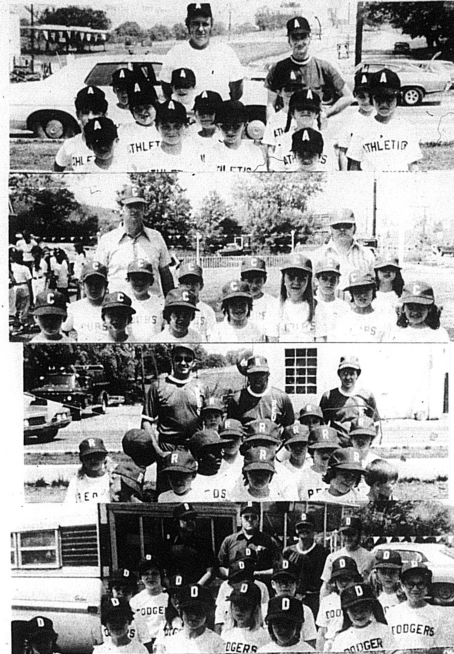
—Nominated for President by the Massachusetts delegation in 1860 convention.
—Declined to have name presented for President at the Charleston convention.
—Admired greatly as an orator, as demonstrated by the overflowing crowd in the Senate when he made his "Farewell Speech" in 1861.
—He studied "Raw's View" of the constitution at West Point which taught that if a state seceded the duty of a soldier reverted to his state—hence Davis, Robert E. Lee, Thomas J. Jackson, the Adjutants and others cast their lot with their States in 1861—unmindful of the consequences.

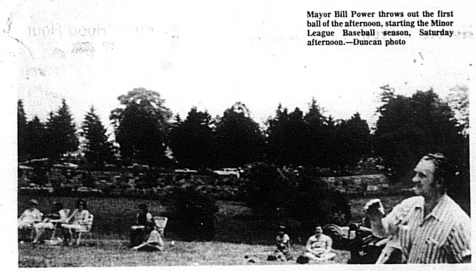
