## Title I is federally funded with no cost to Nicholas school district

The ESEA Title I Program in the Nicholas County Elementary School, is a federally funded program operated through the Kentucky Department of Education. The program is funded 100% by federal funds with no cost to the local school district. Its purpose is to help all educationally deprived students in participating schools throughout the state.

Title I instruction is provided in the areas of Reading, Mathematics, and Readiness in the Nicholas County Elementary School. Target grades are Grades, 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. The school

believes that successful learning is vitally important in these grades if failure success is to be experienced. Participating students are chosen by various means. Past scholastic achievement and standardized test scores help to determine a student's acceptance into the program. Students must be performing at one grade level below or lower to qualify. Lowest scoring students are chosen for classes.

The local elementary school has two remedial reading classrooms, one remedial math classroom and one

remedial classroom. Mrs. Miranda Wilson and Mrs. Frances Todd teach remedial reading, assisted by Mrs. Flurry Duncan. The remedial math classes are taught by Mrs. Jeanette Wallace and Mrs. Mabel Turner. Readiness is taught by Mrs. Charlene Harris. Math and Readiness class teacher assistants are Mrs. Sally Jones and Mrs. Betty Jones.

Participating students attend classes for a period of 30-45 minutes each day, then return to their regular classrooms to receive an equal amount of instruction with the rest of their classmates. Instruction in the remedial classes is planned and conducted according to the students' needs as reported by the classroom teacher to the remedial teachers.

The remedial classrooms are equipped with the latest and most effective teaching-learning devices. Reading machines with flash sentences from a story on a screen are used to increase speed and comprehension in reading. Both Remedial Reading and Remedial Math use the System 90 teaching-learning machines. Looking much like a TV screen, the child uses headphones to receive instructions as he punches keys and views the screen. These machines teach basic skills through drill. Other equipment includes tape recorders, record players, tape cassette, and variable speed machines for increasing skills.

The Parent Advisory Council is a vital part of the Title I program. Parents of participating students hold three or four meetings per year to plan, implement and evaluate the program. All parents are encouraged to attend in order to better understand the importance of Title I in the total school curriculum.

Bagland, executive director, Occupational Safety and Health Division, Kentucky Department of Labor, and Alvin L. Goldman, UK professor of law, who will serve as chairman-emeritus.
