The second annual World Championship Quarter Horse Show, to be held Nov. 7-11 at the Kentucky Fair and Exposition Center in Louisville, will bring together an unprecedented number of the nation's top Quarter Horses in competition.

Corn—Production is forecast at a record 5,727 million bushels as of Oct. 1, up 1 percent (50 million bushels) from Sept. 1 and 2 percent above 1974. Sorghum Grain—Production is forecast at 776 million bushels, down 1 percent (19 million bushels) from a month earlier but 23 percent more than last year.
