

Plans announced for 1975 Bluegrass 4-H, FFA show

The 1975 Bluegrass 4-H and FFA District Beef Show is scheduled to begin with an on-foot show at Clay-Wachs Stockyards in Lexington on Monday, Sept. 22, according to Kentucky Commissioner of Agriculture Wendell P. Butler.

Butler said weighing of entries will begin at 9:30 a.m. on the day of the show, and that all entries must be placed on the grounds by 11 a.m. Weighing entries would be completed by 11 noon, with the on-foot show scheduled to begin at 1 p.m. A pre-sale dinner has been set for 6:30 p.m., and the sale starts at 7 p.m.

In addition to the on-foot show, which is to be judged by Jack Hagadone, manager of Sutherland Farm, Prospect, Ky., all steers competing in the on-foot show are eligible for carcass evaluation.

Dr. York Varney will serve as carcass judge, and he will report on the results of the carcass contest at the Bluegrass Steer Show Banquet, which will be held Saturday evening, Sept. 27, beginning at 7 p.m. in the U.S. Good Barn on the campus of the University of Kentucky.

The Bluegrass Show is one of four district beef shows held throughout the state. The Kentucky Department of Agriculture is happy to sponsor these activities in cooperation with the University of Kentucky Extension Service and the Division of Vocational Agriculture Education of the State Department of Education.

Commissioner Butler urged 4-H and FFA members to attend the show, saying, "It will give these young agriculturalists an opportunity to learn about the type of beef animals the market is demanding."

COMPUTERIZED SCHEDULING INAUGURATED Largest student body ever enrolled at High School

Nicholas County High School has enrolled approximately 430 students this school year, the largest enrollment ever at the local high school. This is an increase of almost 80 students over the 350 who attended last year, according to Cobble Lee, principal. He thought you might like to hear some of the improvements, both academically and otherwise, available to these students.

In order to facilitate scheduling for large numbers of students, a computerized scheduling system was started last spring. The student's class choices are marked on a scheduling sheet. This information is fed into the computer at the central location and the computer casts out conflicts, and sets up schedules. Print-out sheets of each class, alphabetized, are provided each teacher.

Pre-registration will again be held around the first of March for next year. This new system, a first at the local school, saves school officials a lot of headaches, according to Mr. Lee.

Mr. Lee said that since Nicholas County has adopted the computerized scheduling, Bath and Bourbon Counties have followed suit.

Another first this year is the "Independent Study" program. This program is designed for those who fall through the cracks of the regular school day because of working in tobacco, and those who are behind in a course.

In order to qualify for Independent Study, the student and his parents must sign a work contract. An "incomplete" grade is given for the first nine weeks. This grade can be improved during the second nine weeks. Mr. Lee said that teachers were really helping the students in this way before the Independent Study program, but now he is officially providing the time in which to do so.

Special Education Classes are also available at the high school. The largest of these classes has 10 students enrolled, Mr. Lee stated.
