We'd like to take this opportunity to remind ourselves of the marvelous assets we have in the Nicholas County Library and in the Buffalo Trace Regional Library both here in Carlisle. How are we lucky enough, in such a remote, to have regional libraries which serve Bath, Bourbon, Clark, Harrison, Lewis, Mason, Menifee, Nicholas and Rowan counties? Because in 1961, Nicholas County voters passed a 6% cent tax per \$100 library tax—the highest of any county in the state. The 1/2 cent was used to build the first library building we have on Broadway. The 6 cents is used to broaden the local library.

The State Library placed the regional library here because Nicholas county thought enough of a library to approve this new tax. Other counties have turned down similar taxes and still others voted smaller amounts of tax for libraries.
