Home Ec classes sponsor playschool

During the months of March and April the Nicholas County High School Home Economics 1 class, Family Living class, and Semester Child Development classes are sponsoring three playschools. The playschool classes are being held as part of the Child Development Unit in the home economics classes. These opportunities help the high school students to learn to enjoy, understand, and accept children. The Family Living room is divided up into four areas. These areas are the housekeeping and science area, the active play area, the quiet play area, and the music area. These are equipped with all the necessary learning materials. Each day the activities are based on a different theme and a different group is in charge of the day's activities. Another group sits in on the session and observes the children's actions.

In each of the four areas there is at least one helper to guide the children with their play. The first thing on the schedule is free play. In this they may play in any area. Second there is story time in which the children sit together and listen to stories and records, watch puppets, or play games. This is the place where the theme is emphasized. Next they have creative play in which they make things tying in with the story and theme. Then last there is a small nutritious snack.
