to "nominate as presidential preference primary candidates all those generally advocated and nationally recognized as candidates of the political parties for the office of President of the United States."

On the Republican side, the board is expected to nominate President Ford and Ronald Reagan.

On the Democratic side, candidates expected to be nominated in Kentucky include former Gov. Jimmy Carter of Georgia; Sen. Frank Church of Idaho; former Sen. Fred Harris of Oklahoma; Sen. Henry M. Jackson of Washington; Mrs. Ellen McCormack, the anti-abortion candidate from New York; Rep. Morris Udall of Arizona; and Gov. George Wallace of Alabama.

Anyone not nominated by the board who still wants to run in the Kentucky primary has until 45 days before the primary to get on the ballot by filing a petition signed by 1,000 members of his party who endorse his candidacy.

The deadline for registering to vote in the Primary is April 26.
