**Two dollar bill available April 13**

The new two-dollar bill will take its place as a regular part of the nation's currency when it becomes available to the public through commercial banks

On April 13, Thomas Jefferson's birthday, Jefferson's portrait, painted in the early 1800's by Gilbert Stuart, will appear on the face of the new bill. The back of the note will feature a rendition of "The Signing of the Declaration of Independence" painted by John Trumbull during the post-Revolutionary War period. The painting now hangs in the Trumbull Gallery at Yale University. Reproductions will be used for the new bill.

The two-dollar note was first issued in the current familiar size as a United States note with Jefferson's portrait in 1828 and continued to be printed, in several series, until 1962. It was officially discontinued in 1966. There are slightly more than 115 million of these notes still in the hands of the public.

Lack of public demand was given as the reason for discontinuing the two-dollar bill. However, the limited demand has been attributed in part to the low levels of production which gave the public the impression the bills were unavailable or in oddity. At that time, only 6 million two-dollar notes were printed per year, and the total of two-dollar bills in circulation accounted for only one-third of one percent of all outstanding currency.

In contrast, 600 million of the new two-dollar bills will be produced in 1976 and in each year thereafter. It is hoped that in time the new bill will replace about half the one-dollar bills currently in circulation.

The successful circulation of the two-dollar bill could save the U.S. Treasury and the Federal Reserve System as much as \$35 million in printing and other costs over the next five years. The new bill will also provide greater convenience by allowing them to carry and handle less currency. It is hoped that the convenience, cost savings, and appealing design of the new note will assure public acceptance.
