hundredweight on unborn lambs sold or slaughtered in 1975 was also announced by USDA. This payment is designed to compensate growers for the wool they market on five lambs rather than on shorn wool. The payment is based on the shorn wool payment rate, average weight of wool per hundredweight of lambs, and value of lamb's wool.

Subsidies of 1½ cents a pound from 1975 shorn wool payments and 7½ cents per hundred pounds of live weight from 1975 lamb payments will be made to finance advertising, sales promotion and related market development activities. These subsidies, provided for in the National Wool Act, were approved by an 85.5 percent favorable vote by sheepmen voting in a November 1974 referendum.

USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service will begin making the payments to growers shortly through its county office.

The average of \$1.36 a pound received by growers who sold Mohair in 1975 was \$1.56, the announced support level of 80.2 cents a pound. Therefore, no government payments will be required on 1975 marketings of Mohair.

street, if the street is extended, the same quality houses should be built. The newly formed Planning and Zoning Commission was asked to review the situation and report back to Council by next meeting. The Commission has jurisdiction over a three mile radius outside the city limits. Veach Berry, chairman, said that the Commission is scheduled to meet April 28, but that he would try to arrange an earlier meeting regarding this matter.

Berry also said that an attorney and building engineer are being sought by the Commission. A.V. "Doc" Harrier has accepted an appointment as chairman of the Adjustment Board. Two others will be appointed to this Board, Berry said.

Blue Grass Area Development District (BGADD) has helped the City set up the Zoning Commission. BGADD is also updating the City map.

Mayor Bill Power read a letter from the Bureau of Outdoor Recreation accepting Carlisle's request to withdraw from the grant it was awarded for the Carlisle School property.

In another letter, Carlisle-Nicholas County Chamber of Commerce president Life L. Smith advised that the fathers will attend regular meetings of the Chamber on the second Thursday of each month at the Library.

Rev. Dallas Saug was granted his request to have two "Handicapped Children" spots designated in the parking places in front of the Baptist Church steps. If any other church requests such a parking space, it will be granted the same.

Browne Hillier was granted permission to move the pool from Main Street to Spring Street. The vote was 5-2, with Alex Crawford and Julian Green voting against the motion.

A hearing has been scheduled by the Board to review Bobby Fryman's request for payment. The Hon. Gerald Krueger, Board Referee, will hear the case May 15 at 9 a.m. at the Nicholas County Courthouse.
