On Tuesday Bourbon County was soundly defeated 18-1. In a double header Thursday, the Jackets won the first game 17-5, and lost the second one 7-8. Paris defeated the local players 10-9 on Friday. The Jackets defeated Mason County Saturday in both games 15-6 and 17-4.
Coach Billy Keen Anderson said Monday that the top hitters this year are Mike Matton with a batting average of .575, Tony Ritchie .500, and Greg Letcher .409. The most runs batted-in has been scored by Letcher with 19, and David Snapp 16. Most runs scored belongs to Ritchie with 17, and Ritchie and Letcher are tied with three for most home runs this season.
The pitching statistics are Ricky Hicks won four, lost none; Bobby Tinscher won three, lost one; and Greg Letcher pitched a shut-out recently for a 1-0 record.
The team competes with Meigs County and Mt. Sterling at the 4:30 p.m. today (April 23) at the Carcino Country Club Golf Course.
