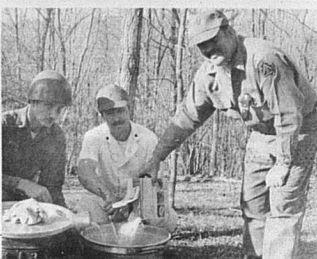

## TAXPAYERS CAN CORRECT TAX RETURN ERRORS AFTER FILING

Taxpayers who discover after filing their return that they made an error can correct the mistake by filing a Form 1040X. Paul Niederacker, IRS District Director for Kentucky, said recently.

The forms are available at local IRS offices or can be obtained by using the 1968 form blank in the tax package. The 1968 form must be filed by taxpayers within three years from the date of the original return or two years from the date of the tax payment, whichever is later, Niederacker advised.
