[Editor's Note: The author of this article which was printed in the June 30, 1976 issue of The Advertiser is a descendant of Ulrich Huffstutter through his daughter Susanna who married Jesse Wilson, Mrs. James Wood, Route 1, Carlisle brought the article to The Carlisle Mercury.]

Ulrich Huffstutter was born in Switzerland, probably the Canton (or county) of Bern, about 1730. In Swiss records the surname is usually spelled Hochstetter and by some accounts means resident or city dweller (stetter) of Hochstetter.

After his arrival in America he evidently lived in Maryland where he may have had relatives. An old family history states that he fought under the British General Braddock in the French and Indian War. Since "Braddock's Defeat" on July 9, 1755 was a famous battle of that war it is assumed that Ulrich was present and fought. A famous American also present at this battle was George Washington, who was a lieutenant colonel in the Virginia militia.
