Since this is pickling season, this week I will give some pickle recipes that you just do give them a try.

Some of these may be a bit different to you but do give them a try.

PICKLED STRING BEANS
Select tender beans without strings if possible. Keep them full length, but snip ends and remove strings, if any. Soak beans overnight in enough brine to cover 1/4 cup salt to each quart water. Drain, rinse in cold water and dry with cloth. Pack beans on end in sterilized jars, adding a few bits of chili peppers, mustard and celery seeds. For each quart jar allow about 3 cups vinegar, 1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar and a small piece of horseradish root. Heat vinegar, sugar and horseradish to boiling and fill each jar at once. Allow about 1 1/2 lbs. of beans for each quart jar.

GREEN TOMATO PICKLE
1 peck green tomatoes, sliced 1/2 white onions, sliced salt
2 tablespoons celery seed
1 tablespoon mustard seed
1 cup mixed pickle pickles
4 shredded red pepper pods

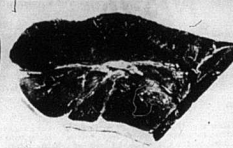
