PICKLES AND RELISHES

Since this is still pickling season, and cucumbers, beans, and tomatoes are still in abundance, here is a basic recipe that can be used for the above items:

BASIC DILL CUCUMBER PICKLES
25 medium size cucumbers
2 stalks fresh dill
1 1/2 bay leaves or more
1/2 tablespoon peppercorns
1/2 cup vinegar
10 cup salt
2 1/2 quarts water

Soak the cucumbers overnight in cold water. Make a brine of the water, salt, and peppercorns. Bring to a good rolling boil and cool.
In a large crock put a layer of cucumbers, a few pieces of the dill and a bay leaf. Repeat until the cucumbers are all used. Put dill on the top layer and pour the brine over all.
Cover with grape leaves, put a large plate on top and weight down to keep the cucumbers under the brine.
After a week, add 1/2 cup vinegar. Ready to use after two weeks more. Keep the scum cleaned off the surface of the brine.

DILL TOMATOES
Choose small green tomatoes; but do no make no overnight. Use the same formula as for Dill Cucumber Pickles.

DILL BEANS
Choose green stringless beans or wax beans. Cook in boiling salted water for seven minutes; add use the same formula as for Dill Cucumber Pickles.

PICKLED ONIONS
Blanch small white onions in boiling water 1 to 2 minutes; dip in cold water; remove thin slice of root and onion and slip off skin; pack onions in jars. For each quart jar of onions, use 1 tablespoon mixed spices in cloth bag, dissolve 1 1/4 cups sugar in 1 cup vinegar; add spices, cover and simmer 40 to 60 minutes; then add enough boiling water to make 1 cup. Pour hot solution over onions, partially sealed jars; process 30 minutes in boiling water bath. Allow about 1 pound onions for each quart jar to be filled.

Peel and slice 4 quarts small cucumbers; cover with brine (1/4 cup salt to
