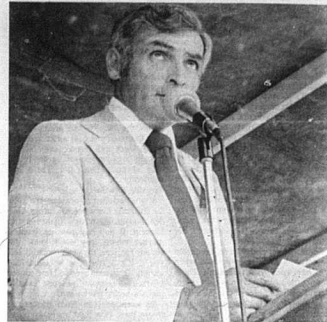


State Bicentennial celebration held

Rep. Adrian Arnold, M. Sterling, was among the many dignitaries who spoke briefly Thursday during the formal program at Blue Licks.

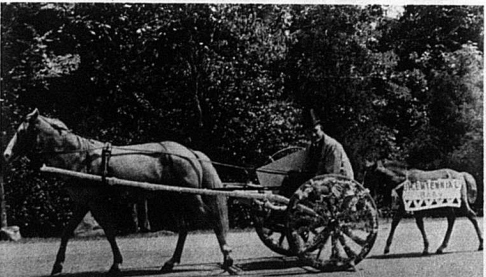

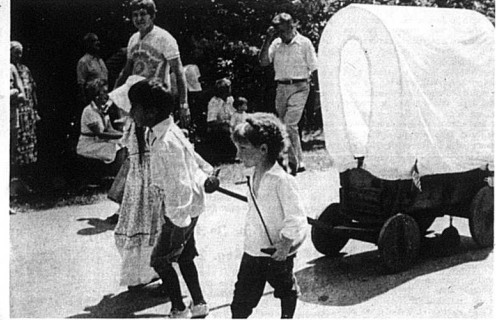
The Nichettes Baton group marched in the Blue Licks Parade. The Kentucky Babes, the newest class of real young children, led the group.
