Special two-day firearms deer hunt scheduled Nov. 16-17 in Union county

FRANKFORT—A two-day firearms deer hunt will be held on the Higginson-Henry Wildlife Management Area (formerly part of Camp Breckinridge) in Union county, Nov. 16 and 17. The hunt will be by special permit only issued by the Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources.

Persons wishing to participate in this quota hunt should write to Area Manager, Higginson-Henry Wildlife Area, Route 5, Morganfield, Ky. 42427 and request an application for a permit, enclosing a self-addressed, stamped envelope.

All applications must be completed and returned to the above address no later than noon Sept. 4. A drawing will be held at the Union County Court House to select 500 hunters who will be mailed permits to participate in the hunt.

Hunters successful in the drawing should receive their permits by Sept. 25. Unsuccessful applicants will not be notified except upon request.

The permit will authorize the hunter to hunt on a designated tract of the Wildlife Area both days or until he takes a deer during the two-day period. All hunters must register in and out of the area check station each day.

The limit is one deer of either sex. The only authorized weapons will be shotguns with shot ammunition in the muzzle-loading rifles .38 caliber or larger. There is no charge for the two-day permit.

Advanced to finals for fifth time

For the fifth time in six years, Reta Ebbink of Torrance, Calif. has advanced to the finals of Pillsbury National Bake-Off contest. Mrs. Ebbink will fly to Boston to compete against 99 other finalists at the Statler Hilton, Aug. 27 through 31. The judging will be televised Aug. 31.

Mrs. Ebbink's recipe this year is in the biscuit category—a beef casserole with stuffed biscuits on top. In past years she has entered recipes for caramel, candy biscuits, cheddar rolls, cheesy crescent snacks and crunchy sweet rolls.

The finalists will compete for awards which include two grand prizes of \$25,000 each, three \$5,000 category prizes and eight \$2,000 group prizes, a total of \$11,000.

Mrs. Ebbink submitted her recipe for preliminary judging earlier this year. Besides top eating quality, the rules call for favorite family recipes that have wide popular appeal and are good values.

Son participates in Navy rescue

Navy Boiler Technician Second Class Thomas Anderson, son of Ben Anderson of Route 3, Carlisle, participated in the rescue of more than 300 American and foreign evacuees from Beirut, Lebanon as a crewmember of the tripartite USS McCloy in support of "Operation Fluid Drive."

The refugees boarded unarmed landing vessels and were ferried to the amphibious transport ship USS Coronado. The extraction of the civilians from the beleaguered Lebanese capital was accomplished with incident and the evacuees arrived safely aboard the Coronado for transport to Athens.

In a message from President Ford, the task force was commended for its high degree of professionalism which contributed to the success of the operation. His ship is homeported in Norfolk, Va., and is currently deployed as a unit of the U.S. Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean.

A 1960 graduate of Purdue University, West Lafayette, Ind., with a bachelor of science degree, he joined the Navy in November 1969.
